I. PRAYER IMPLIES INTIMATE COMMUNION.

II. RECOGNIZES THAT ACCESS TO GOD IS ONLY THROUGH CHRIST.

⁸ First, I thank my God <u>through Jesus Christ</u> for all of you, because your faith is proclaimed in all the world

²³ In that day you will ask nothing of me. Truly, truly, I say to you, whatever you ask of the Father in my name, he will give it to you. ²⁴ Until now you have asked nothing in my name. Ask, and you will receive, that your joy may be full.

III. IS CONSTANT AND FERVENT.

¹³ I do not want you to be unaware, brothers, that I have often intended to come to you (but thus far have been prevented), in order that I may reap some harvest among you as well as among the rest of the Gentiles.
